Year 1 - The London Museum

Year 1 visited The London Museum on Wednesday. This trip was linked to learning about London and animals. The exhibition was called "Beasts of London" and explored the fascinating roles animals played in shaping the capital. They were guided through time from the Roman era through Medieval London and right up to the present day. They discovered how animals – from lions and elephants, to horses, rats and pigeons – have shaped the city and its beastly history.

Year 2 - The Natural History Museum, Tring

On Tuesday, Year 2 visited The Natural History Museum in Tring. During their visit children learned about animals and their habitats which links to their science work. They took part in a workshop and learnt about artic animals and polar bears. Not only did they learn about the animals they also learnt about their habitat. The children did a range of activities which included looking at and sorting animals, they also had the opportunity to identify animals from skeletons which included looking at a polar bear skull, a whale's rib and a penguin's wing.

Year 3 - Watford Central Mosque and Wellspring Church

Also on Tuesday, Year 3 visited Watford Central Mosque and Wellspring Church. At the mosque the children visited the men's and women's praying areas. They were also very fortunate to hear a call to pray. Whilst visiting the Wellspring Church pupils learnt about Jesus. They also observed and took part in some dance routines. At both places of worship, pupils learnt about the respective religious books of the two religions.















Sports Leader Training

This week 20 of our Year 5 pupils had Sports Leader training which was delivered by Queens' School. The training gives pupils the skills to organise and run games for younger children. They will also be able to organise a Sports Festival. Our Sports Leaders will be running games during the lunch breaks for pupils in Key stage 1.



Family Learning - Dangerous Dinosaurs
