Dear Parents/Carers,

It has certainly been a hectic week with the changing weather conditions, autumn is approaching rapidly. ## **Dangerous Dinosaurs**

We are happy to once again work with the Community Learning Partnership, Hertfordshire Adult and Family Learning Service (HAFLS) for family learning with a focus on English, and in particular focus on phonics for pupils in Reception and Year 1. ## **PSHCE including Relationships Education, Relationships and Sex Education (RSE), and Health Education**

As parents might be aware there have been some statutory changes placed on schools in terms of their curriculum about relationship education. These changes are statutory from September 2020.

At Holywell Primary we are currently working our way through theses to ensure we get the best possible curriculum for our pupils and community. At the moment, we have made no changes to our current curriculum to reflect these changes and will update parents of these once a final decision has been made. We appreciate there are concerning reports in the press about what schools and local authorities are doing, but we just want to reassure parents that we are considering the changes needed very carefully and will update them when our relationships curriculum is finalised.

## **Lettings**

We work hard to make savings in school and always explore ways to enhance our income each year. One way in which we try to raise funds is through letting parts of the school site. The school lends itself well to cater for many different kinds of events. Last year the school hall, for example, was let out for a wedding reception. Lettings rates are very competitive and we would recommend parents look on the school website if they are interested in hiring part of the school for any kind of occasion.

We would like to remind Year 6 parents School Health will be coming in to carry out a series of health checks on their children. 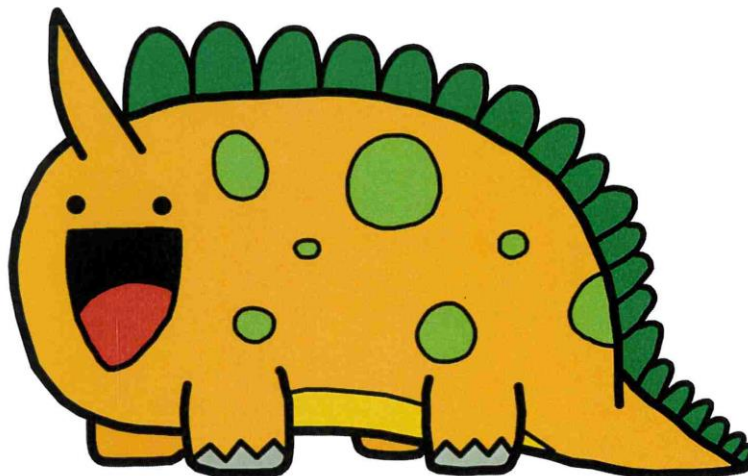

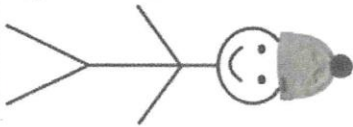

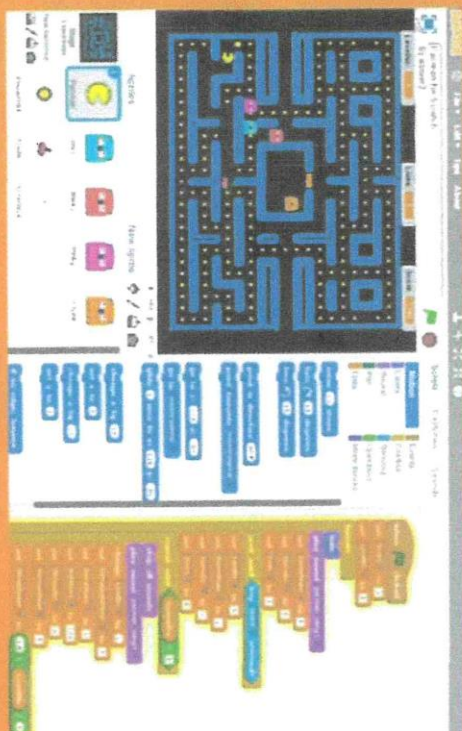

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#### **Who Are We?**

We are part of Hertfordshire Music Service (Hertfordshire County Council) and we are the biggest music centre in Hertfordshire. We have over a 1000 students and 70 teachers attending each week and we are here for all your children's musical needs. We have activities for babies through to adults. We are open 6 days a week and would love you to be part of our music school.

#### **Why?**

We are passionate that all children in our community should have the opportunity to make music. We aim to inspire and empower all our students to have a life long love of music.

#### **Where are we?**

We are based in a wonderful purpose built music school (the big green glass cube building on the Rickmansworth Road) and share the site with Watford Boys Grammar School

#### **What we Offer**

We offer instrumental and vocal tuition from our highly qualified teaching staff and students are encouraged to join our orchestras, bands, choirs and chamber ensembles. Students have the opportunity to regularly perform in concerts at the music school.

Key Stage Two instrumentalists and vocalists are invited to our special Music Making days at WSM e.g. Wind Band Day, String Day. Your child will receive invitations for these through your child's school.

Our teachers also go into schools so your child may already learn through the Hertfordshire Music Service.

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### **Examples of Special Opportunities for Younger Musicians**

**Sing Make Play** is our Saturday Morning Music School for Key Stage 2 Students, where we build musical skills through singing, playing instruments and composing.

**Explore Reception and Explore One and Two** are our Saturday morning classes for Reception and Key Stage One students where we lay musical foundations through practical music making.

**I Play** group lessons are an opportunity for your child to try an instrument for a term to see if they like it. Different instruments are offered each term. Please contact us for the latest information.

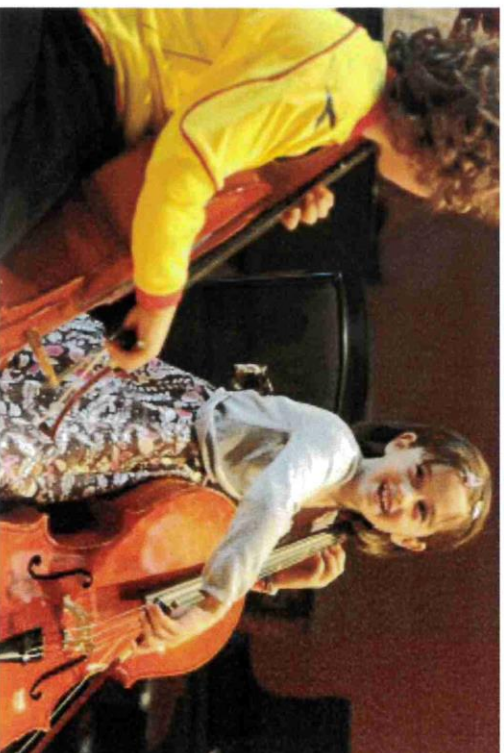

## 'I Play'

Group lessons for our beginner instrumentalists



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### What is '1 Play'?

'1 Play' is an introduction/ taster to playing an instrument. Your child will learn as part of a class to play either a woodwind, brass, string or percussion instrument. The lessons will be every week for 45 mins and the course will run for 1 term. There will be 10 lessons in total and it is important for your child to attend most regularly. We will supply instruments for the lessons each week and these will remain at the music school. If you wish to buy an instrument so your child can practice at home please do so. All the basics will be covered and there will be lots of music making from the start. Your child will learn how to produce a sound, hold the instrument, play as a group, follow a conductor and play tunes! Some teachers will start to use musical notation.

### How to help your child choose an instrument.

Start exploring different instruments and see which sound appeals to your child. The choice of instrument is very personal and the more your child likes it the more they will want to play it! Listen to instruments on the internet. Come to our concerts and Open Evening at WSM and discuss your options with our teachers.

### What Happens Next?

At the end of the term there will be a '1 Play' Concert in the last lesson to showcase the children's work.  
At the end of the course you may...

A. Enrol for individual, shared or group lessons, (children can buddy up with their new friends from the '1 Play' class), at WSM in your chosen instrument. Teachers will be able to advise you to make the best choice for your child. Costs are as follows and based on 11 lessons a term:

Individual 30 minute lessons	£231.00
Individual 20 minute lessons	£154.00
Shared 30 minute lessons	£115.50

At this stage you will have to supply your own instrument, although we are able to loan a few endangered instruments!

### Here are your choices:

**Woodwind:** Flute, Clarinet, Oboe, Bassoon

**Brass:** Cornet, Trumpet, Trombone, Horn, Tenor Horn

**Strings:** Violin, Viola, 'Cello, Double Bass

**Percussion:** Orchestral, World Percussion, Kit

B. Enrol for a different '1 Play' course so your child can have a go playing another instrument.

C. Nothing at all. Hopefully your child has enjoyed the experience!
